Hello, Clarkston UMC family! As many of you know, the Administrative Council has been exploring a transition to a simpler model of church governance. In the past, multiple members have attended workshops, and even before my arrival as pastor you all have experimented with some changes.

Well, now we are moving forward with a wholesale structure change—first, to encourage more ministry participation and innovation; second, to be better stewards of our time and volunteer resources; and third, to reflect the way we conduct our business currently.

Our next step toward fully implementing this new structure is to host a town hall style meeting. This will take place April 23, right after church gathering time in the fellowship hall. The purpose of the meeting is to hear your questions, suggestions, and for you to share any potential problems that the model we will be using might have. We will use those to help us refine the model further.

To shrink the amount of time spent in the town hall meeting on April 23 (we hope to keep it around 15 to 30 minutes), I am presenting information here for you to read prior to the meeting. Please read and bring your questions, ideas, and suggestions on April 23. Thank you!

PROPOSED SIMPLE GOVERNANCE MODEL FOR CLARKSTON UMC

CHURCH COUNCIL = 13 voting members

- 1 Lay Leader (Council Chair)
- 1 Lay Member to Annual Conference
- 1 Other Person (possibly last Lay Leader?)
- 3 People with Trustees/Property interest (3 year terms, each in one class)
- 3 People with Finance interest (3 year terms, each in one class)
- 3 People with SPR interest (3 year terms, each in one class)
- Pastor

The Church Council is responsible (and has authority) to keep the entire ministry of the congregation focused on the mission. It sets the basic boundaries (policies) within which the congregation lives out its vision. Boundaries include allocation of resources (including budget), ethical standards, and adequate processes (such as financial practices and audits). It establishes goals for the overall effectiveness of the congregation in fulfilling its mission. It holds the Lead Pastor accountable to fruitfulness in meeting the missional goals set for the congregation.

IMPORTANT – the entire council functions together as Trustees, Finance, and SPRC. The people specifically elected for interest in the areas of facilities, finance, and human relations provide focus and information in their area of specialty, but do not make decisions apart from the council.

The Church Council is accountable to the mission (it is God's Church), to the standards of conduct for its members (such as participation in meetings, worship, giving and so on) and to the congregation (through their annual election of leaders to whom they entrust the mission of the congregation).

COMMITTEE ON NOMINATIONS AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

The Discipline requires that there be a Committee on Nominations and Leadership Development (¶258.1). The committee is to be composed of not more than 9 persons elected to 3-year terms in 3 classes, plus the lay leader and pastor. The pastor shall be the chair of this committee.

This committee will work with the pastor throughout the year to identify, call, and equip leadership for the mission of the congregation. They shall annually recommend to the Charge Conference a slate of qualified and called persons for election to all elected offices in the congregation. When elected offices become vacant for any reason in between charge conferences the committee will make nominations to the Church Council for ad-interim election to fill these vacancies.

MINISTRY TEAMS

There may be as many ministry teams as there are ministries. A ministry may be a regular, ongoing program (such as a weekly worship service or the youth fellowship group), an annual event (like a volunteer recognition dinner or family retreat), or even a single major event (a one-time mission trip).

Every ministry will have a ministry team. Ministry teams may be almost any size, depending on the demands of the ministry they are carrying out and each ministry team will have a ministry team leader.

Every ministry team leader is a staff person, whether paid or unpaid. The ministry team leader is responsible for organizing the people who are doing the specific ministry and for focusing the ministry team on the goals and outcomes it has adopted. The ministry team leaders (staff) all work within the alignment authority of the Lead Pastor who holds all the ministries accountable to the missional goals established by the Church Council.

Decisions about how (within the boundaries and policies) to reach the goals of a ministry will be made by the ministry team doing the ministry. The goals and methods of the ministry team will be established in consultation with the Lead Pastor to assure their alignment with the overarching ministry goals set by the Council. The ministry team leader will be accountable to see that the team is working toward fulfillment of those goals.

The Lead Pastor will establish adequate processes to ensure alignment of the ministry teams so that:

- each ministry understands and embraces its part in the overall mission of the congregation,
- ministries are not unnecessarily competing with or limiting one another,
- gaps in ministry are addressed, and
- mutual support and synergy are built between all the ministries of the congregation.

The primary authority of the Lead Pastor regarding ministry teams is to ensure alignment and fruitfulness. The responsibility of the Lead Pastor is equipping (inspiring), and deploying them toward fruitfulness in the mission, vision, and values of the congregation as established by the Church Council.

MINISTRY CORE TEAM

The pastor and lay leader will lead this group. It will include all leaders elected by other church groups (such as United Methodist Women's President or representative, United Methodist Men's President or representative, or Youth Council President). It will also include the ministry team leaders of any other significant on-going program bodies in the church. This group will meet regularly to coordinate ministry programs so that they are mutually supportive and well aligned with the mission of the congregation.

As you prayerfully consider giving each month to the church, please keep in mind that the Building Fund is above and beyond the General Fund. Money donated to the Building Fund will be used for replacing and updating appropriate equipment.

We've been in this building for quite some time so major items are starting to wear out and are in need of replacement. Heating and air conditioning units are an estimated \$25,000. Roof repairs will need done along with some carpet repairs. We are considering a change over from the current two hot water heaters to one efficient water heater. The Trustees would like to be able to begin these updates in the near future. If you have questions, please talk to John Manis, Joel Ford or Glenn Kinloch.
